We heal through experiences.

Since 2001, we have been working to provide healing experiences for children living with serious or chronic illnesses and their families—giving them the chance to live fuller lives.

Through our free programs, children, their siblings, parents, and classmates rediscover their inner strength and experience the power of a supportive community. From the start of hospital treatment to the return to school, we are there every step of the way.

With our work, we aim to build a healthier society in all four countries where we operate: Hungary, the Czech Republic, Poland, and Slovakia.



WELCOME

For the past 24 years, Bátor Tábor has been helping to give childhood back to children whose lives have been turned upside down by serious or chronic illness.

Our free programs – including camps, hospital and school outreach, and online experiences – are all designed to support children's mental and emotional healing. Wherever we run our programs, our goal remains the same: to create experiences that empower children to discover they are capable of more than they ever imagined. This has been proven to play a vital role not only in their recovery but also in the mental well-being of their entire families.

I only recently joined this miracle, and every single day brings a new source of inspiration. As a Foundation, we are constantly working to grow our positive impact on society and to create even more of these meaningful moments for children and their families. We're expanding into more hospitals and schools, increasing the number of camps we offer, and continually evolving – even embracing new technologies – to reach more families than ever before. And of course, we're also developing our camp location itself, so that each year it can remain a true place of wonder for the children.

Perhaps one camper put it best: "Bátor Tábor is like a machine – you put in a sick, tired child, and out comes a happier, healthier kid, full of unforgettable experiences."

On behalf of the children and families we serve, thank you for your support. For them, this means a whole new world of hope and opportunity.



STATUS REPORT FROM THE CAMP



In the summer of 2024, we held four camp sessions. In addition to our traditional camps for children aged 7–13 and teens aged 14–18, we were delighted to bring back the Sibling Camp in a renewed format. This special session, previously held in the spring, welcomes children living with illness together with their healthy siblings. It aims to strengthen the bond between siblings through activities they can enjoy both separately and together.

We also launched a newly structured International Family Camp, where Slovak and Czech families spent five unforgettable days together, creating joyful memories.

2024 also marked the conclusion of the ninth cycle of our Bereavement Camp, designed for families who have lost a child due to illness, accident, or complications around birth. In the autumn, we hosted three Family Camps for families raising children under the age of 7 who are living with severe illness.



THE MOST IMPORTANT **MILESTONES**


- From spring to autumn, campers joined us for nine camp sessions. To our great joy, we were able to bring back a beloved camp type to our program selection: we organized our Sibling Camp in the form of a six-day session.
- In 2024, GO! Program held its 1000th hospital session and welcomed

its 10,000th participant. According to teacher feedback, our School Program has even impacted parents—after the sessions, complaints give way to open and respectful communication!

• Thank you for all our volunteers! Altogether in the 4 countries where we operate, we organized our programs with 806 enthusiastic and trained volunteers. On average, 1 volunteer took part in 3 programs.

SCHOOL OUTREACH PROGRAM

Our School Program helps classrooms become communities where everyone feels safe and welcome—where coming back to school after illness is easy for the child, and inclusion comes naturally to their peers.

In 2024, our school program reached 20 classrooms, engaging 479 participants—26 teachers and 453 students. Among the children, 31 were living with a serious or chronic illness. As part of the program, we conducted 23 perspective–shaping interviews with teachers. We also expanded the program with two special initiatives: adding an extra third session to strengthen community bonds, and bringing our activities to children in a small village in Somogy County. Beyond Hungary, our school program reached 172 participants in Slovakia and 101 in the Czech Republic, for a total of 752 participants across three countries.

Because we believe it's vital to share our approach with as many schools and educators as possible, our colleagues also led sensitizing trainings for an additional 175 children and 13 teachers, creating space for dialogue and play around inclusion and support. In addition, 32 teachers joined our full-day workshop organized in partnership with the Hősök Tere Foundation, where we shared therapeutic recreation tools and solution-focused practices. Throughout the year, we continued to support teachers through our online workshop series.



GO! AND ONLINE GO! PROGRAM

In 2024, our program reached new milestones: we welcomed our 10,000th hospital participant, and surpassed 1,000 sessions delivered. In Hungary alone, more than 3,100 children joined us at our online and offline programs.

We also launched the program in a new location, in the city of Pécs, meaning that in addition to Budapest, we now offer regular hospital visits in three regional locations. Working alongside our partner organizations, we travelled across the country to bring the spirit of camp to as many places as possible.

Our online programs continued to enjoy unwavering popularity. Month after month, our coordinators filled each virtual session with creative ideas—ensuring that fun and joy could reach the children through their screens, too. Our volunteers remain the heart and engine of the program, therefore, trainings were held to support them, in Slovakia, Poland, and Hungary in 2024.

The very first Outreach Day Training was a highlight, organized in partnership with the School Program, where we trained 90 new volunteers for the GO! program. During the trainings, we not only welcomed newbies, but also provided returning ones with meaningful opportunities for growth.

Together with our experienced experts, we explored new ways to bring the camp experience even closer to children – within the walls of the hospitals. Additional two "Outreach Extra" trainings were delivered in collaboration with the School Program, helping volunteers expand their knowledge, tools, and connections.



ON INTERNATIONAL WATERS *

CZECHIA

This summer, we hosted our very first International Family Camp for Slovak and Czech families, where not only children affected by illness, but also their parents and siblings joined us for an unforgettable camp experience. We continued running our online workshops, and successfully launched a new format: "Workshop Live", an arts-focused event featuring a renowned Czech sculptor.

Our School Program also continued to grow—this year we organized a joint volunteer training for both Czech and Slovak participants for the first time. We placed strong emphasis on building our volunteer community, organizing regular meetups throughout the year. This series culminated in a playful, skill-building Christmas celebration. In 2024, we gained broader public recognition – Spolu s odvahou, our local partner organization, was featured in several leading Czech media outlets.

SLOVAKIA

In 2024, we continued all four of our core programs: the summer family camp, online and offline workshops, hospital outreach, and our school program. We successfully expanded our hospital

program, which now also operates at the Children's Cardiology

Center in Bratislava. As part of the school program, we visited a special needs classroom for the first time, where all children are living with serious diagnoses. The number of online and offline workshops also increased. At the International Family Camp, families were able to spend meaningful time together in a safe environment—even during treatment. Our greatest achievement was the overwhelmingly positive feedback we received from participants. They highlighted our inclusive approach, and the way we support everyone affected by a child's illness. This family—and community—centered perspective is what makes our programs truly unique.

POLAND

In 2024, our hospital program grew significantly, with three new coordinators joining the team. We held a total of 57 programs in oncology wards, with 307 participants. These programs were designed for children and teenagers who, due to long hospital treatments, had become isolated from their peers. For children living with chronic illness, the programs offer an opportunity to reconnect, build friendships, and engage with one another in a playful and supportive environment.

As a new initiative, we launched the "Museum Program" in cooperation with the Geological and Ethnographic Museums in Warsaw. We held two educational and craft workshops, attended by over 23 children and their parents.

Another major achievement was organizing five separate "City Camps" specifically designed for children and teens who had become socially isolated due to long-term hospital treatment. A total of 35 children participated in these sessions, supported by 44 volunteers, who created a cheerful and inspiring environment for all involved.



MILESTONES AND NEW SUCCESSES

OUR SECOND SUSTAINABILITY REPORT IS COMPLETE

With this report, our goal is to provide a comprehensive overview of our sustainability goals and the results we have achieved so far. We believe that sustainability and value creation go hand in hand, and we have set an ambitious goal: to reach climate neutrality by 2030.









WE LAUNCHED OUR TIKTOK CHANNEL

At the beginning of the year, the Foundation's official TikTok channel was launched, where we share entertaining, educational, and informative content about our activities and mission.

MENTAL WELL-BEING PROGRAMS

The Bátor Tábor Mental Well-being Program offers webinars, workshops, and training sessions for companies, focusing on mental health in the workplace—while also helping fund our mission through the proceeds. All programs are designed and delivered by trainers, coaches, organizational developers, and psychologists, who are also part of our volunteer community. In 2024, we ran a total of 22 programs, reaching more than 1,500 participants.





"ADOPT A HEALING EXPERIENCE" CAMPAIGN

To make the magic of Bátor Tábor possible, many moving parts must come together in perfect harmony. That's why, in summer 2024, we launched a special fundraising campaign, where people could choose which part of our work they wanted to support most—from meals and art supplies to therapy tools and more.

CAMP INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In 2024, we installed heat pump systems in our volunteer accommodations—an important step toward our sustainability goals and a big improvement in summer comfort for our volunteers. We also equipped our main building with a solar thermal system to provide hot water—now every building at camp is powered in part by solar energy. In addition, we carried out major energy efficiency upgrades in our industrial kitchen, helping us serve meals even more efficiently during camp sessions.



ESPORTS CHARITY CAMPAIGN

For the first time ever, our peer-to peer fundraising unit stepped into the world of esports! In December, Esport1.hu hosted a charity livestream, where players raised 621,500 HUF for our cause.

MEMORIES WE ARE HAPPY TO RECALL



PEER-TO-PEER FUNDRAISING

In 2024, our campaigners launched 150 campaigns, raising more than 38.5 million HUF in support of Bátor Tábor. They showed up in large numbers at running events in Budapest and across the country, at the Balaton Cross Swimming, and the Gerecse 50 hiking challenge. For the first time ever, a campaign was launched by a participant under the age of 18, which makes us incredibly proud. Olympic



athletes Boglárka Kapás and Ádám Telegdy also supported us by launching campaigns of their own. A total of 20 corporate and school teams raised funds for us at sporting events and during our December bake sale event. Several of our campaigners went beyond borders—9 of them completed their challenges either partly or entirely abroad.

"Bátor Tábor is a gateway to a better world," said one of our campers in our deeply moving new image film. Our goal is to bring healing experiences to as many children as possible—whether at home, in hospitals, schools, or at camp. In 2024, after hearing the stories of the families we support, 19,488 taxpayers chose to dedicate 1% of their personal income tax to Bátor Tábor.

RTL CHARITY BROADCAST

On May 18, 2024, RTL Hungary aired a special charity edition, featuring heartfelt and uplifting stories shared by camper families and volunteers. Thanks to the broadcast, viewers donated 11,500,500 HUF, which was matched with an additional 10 million HUF by RTL Hungary.



FAMILY DAY IN CAMP

At this year's Family Day in Camp, we spent a lively and memorable day together with nearly a thousand campers, their families, supporters, and volunteers. The highlight of the event was an intimate, heartwarming mini-concert by Balázs Szabó.

CONTEMPORARY ART AUCTION IN BUDAPEST

Our 20th Anniversary Contemporary Art Auction took place at a new venue, the Eiffel Art Studios. A record-breaking 100 artworks went under the hammer, plus one very special piece created by our campers also found a home. The event raised 97 million HUF in support of our programs.







OUR ART AUCTION GOING INTERNATIONAL

Our Contemporary Art Auction was held in Bratislava, Prague, and Warsaw. Across the three international auctions, a total of 97 works found buyers, generating more than 87 million in revenue to support the three international foundations.

SUNDAY FUNDDAY

Formerly known as the All In Challenge, this event was reimagined in 2024 as a hybrid format, combining online and in-person experiences. It was held on a sunny November Sunday at the Normafa Conference Centre. The afternoon was hosted by Évi Barabás, and our volunteers welcomed families with chimney cake, hot chocolate, and plenty of games. Online bidding for our colourful auction items was open for 10 days, helping us raise 6.5 million HUF by the end of the day.





CHARITY GOLF COMPETITION

On September 6, we hosted the 21st Charity Golf Day of the Bátor Tábor Foundation in a fantastic atmosphere. After the morning's friendly tournament, the evening gala dinner was held at the Hilton Budapest in the Buda Castle District. Thanks to our generous sponsors, supporters, and guests, we raised 70 million HUF during this truly memorable day.

YOU CAN BE A LIGHT IN THE NIGHT!

A SELFLESS ACT LIGHTS UP SOMEONE ELSE'S LIFE.

We believe it's important to spread the culture of giving and volunteering. In 2024, nearly 700 wholehearted volunteers joined us across Hungary.

We're proud that with so many dedicated volunteers, we were able to bring healing experiences to life: 9 camp sessions, 20 classes, and more than 200 online and offline GO! programs took place in Hungary. Our international camp also welcomed 35 Czech and Slovak volunteers. Throughout the year, over 120 newbies joined our GO! programs, and another 60 people participated in training sessions for the School Program.

Many return year after year: 136 volunteers have been with us for 10 to 15 years, and this year we celebrated for the first time a volunteer who has been with us for 20 years. Volunteering is more than just helping — it's community, experience, and life-changing encounters all at once. In short: it's an experience that lasts a lifetime.

We also celebrated this year's International Volunteer Day together, under the motto: You are the light. Our volunteers truly are just that — light in children's days, light in the community, and light for one another.

POSITIVELY


We look at the bright side of life. Our messages are positive, and we are optimistic about the future. We focus on solutions and opportunities instead of problems.

TRUSTFULLY


